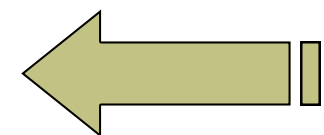

Course Description

Pain is the primary reason for up to 80% of all primary care visits. The severe under treatment of pain in years past has led to immeasurable amounts of pain and suffering in patients with chronic nonmalignant pain syndrome as well as those suffering chronic conditions. The IOM, in its 2011 report, called for a “population health-level strategy for pain prevention, treatment, management, education, reimbursement and research.” This program will cover pain management and current options and updates in treatment for the pain patient and aims to address the topics outlined by the IOM.

Target Audience

Primary Care Practitioners (Family Practice, Internal Medicine), Adolescent Medicine, Gynecologists, Occupational Medicine Practitioners, Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Practitioners, Psychiatrists, Psychologists, Anesthesiology Pain Management Practitioners, Pharmacists, PAs, RNs, NPs, Residents, Students and Other Healthcare Providers in primary health care settings or with an interest in pain management.

Learning Objectives

The information presented at this educational activity should improve participants’ ability to:

- ◆ Test for pain using the most appropriate methods, and identify common pain syndromes.
- ◆ Apply proper basic non-interventional and/ or pharmacological interventions for pain treatment, based on physical examinations.
- ◆ Identify and better understand risks of initiation and maintenance of chronic opioid therapy in nonmalignant pain
- ◆ Develop proficiency in the initiation and maintenance of non-opioid and adjunctive pharmacotherapy in appropriate pain patients
